ITINERARY

Sep 11	Arrive Lusaka, Zambia. Met and transferred to Proflight lounge until 15:10 PM departure to Mfuwe arriving at 16:20 PM. Met by your guide and proceed approximately 45 minutes to the South Luangwa park entrance followed by a short drive to Mfuwe Lodge. Depending on flights some participants may need to overnight in Lusaka or Johannesburg, and we can assist with those arrangements. Overnight Mfuwe Lodge.
Sep 12	You have a three hour game drive through the park to reach Chindeni Bushcamp.
Sep 13	South Luangwa. Chindeni Bushcamp.
Sep 14	South Luangwa. Chindeni Bushcamp.
Sep 15	Game drive transfer through the park to reach Zungulila Bushcamp.
Sep 16	South Luangwa. Zungulila Bushcamp.
Sep 17	South Luangwa. Zungulila Bushcamp.
Sep 18	Morning game drive transfer to the nearby Kapamba Airstrip for your charter flight to Jeki Airstrip from where you will have a game drive transfer to Anabezi Camp deep in the Lower Zambezi National Park. Accommodation at Amanzi Camp.
Sep 19	Lower Zambezi, Amanzi Camp
Sep 20	Lower Zambezi, Amanzi Camp THIRD NIGHT FREE
Sep 21	Lower Zambezi, Amanzi Camp
Sep 22	Morning game drive ending at Jeki Airstrip for a 9:05 flight arriving to Lusaka at 10:10 in time to connect with outbound flights home.

SAFARI COSTS

Cost is \$8,400 per person sharing, Single Supplement \$1,500 including a free night special at Amanzi Camp

NOTE: This is a pay by check or bank wire discounted price. We are able to process credit cards but the non-cash discount price for credit payments is \$8,736 per person.

*Cost includes all internal flights and road transfers, accommodation, meals, drinks (except at Mfuwe Lodge), laundry, park fees, excess baggage limit (total limit of 85 lbs per person) and two dedicated private vehicles and guides at each Bushcamp and Amanzi Camp for just your group.

Tips – On safari we recommend \$25 per person per day -- \$10 to your guide, \$10 for the camp staff and \$5 for your spotter.

INTRODUCTION

Zambia is often referred to as The Real Africa. Of course all other safari areas are very real too but Zambian safaris are rightfully distinguished by the expedition of old adventure that they deliver under the care of exceptional guides in out of the way wilderness areas teeming with wildlife. The atmosphere carries back to the camps as well, they retain a rustic charm yet still deliver extreme comfort and pampering service while maintaining a wonderful on the ground connection to the wilderness areas where they are placed.



Zambian guiding standards are rivaled only by Zimbabwe. Problems in Zimbabwe actually led to many guides moving over to Zambia and the result has been exceptional skills being cultivated in the local Zambian guides. South Luangwa is the birthplace of walking safaris and it is a rare treat to walk in areas where animals are habituated to humans on foot. The area also offers outstanding game drives, both day and night. With the Lower Zambezi you add to the diversity of activities with boating, canoeing and fishing in addition to great game drives.

MFUWE LODGE

SOUTH LUANGWA NATIONAL PARK, ZAMBIA – 1 NIGHT



Mfuwe Lodge is ideal for your first night in South Luangwa National Park, with 18 luxury en-suite thatched chalets, each with a private decking area that overlooks a lagoon that attracts abundant wildlife and game from the African bush. This lodge is renowned for its in camp wildlife viewing so great sightings can come at any time.

This is in the central area of the park that is known for its outstanding wildlife concentrations. You will have an afternoon/night game drive before heading out the next morning.

Scattered along two lagoons' shady banks lie each chalet from where you can enjoy your own private piece of Africa. Secluded covered verandas look out over wallowing hippo and thirsty game in the lagoons, while the newly refurbished African interiors are the perfect place to wind down with their comfortable sitting rooms and en-suite bathrooms with panoramic walk-in showers.



Each chalet is decorated with superb attention to detail and is equipped with everything from refrigerator to shampoo and mosquito repellent. Sunken bath tubs have private views of the lagoon.

The game-viewing potential at Mfuwe Lodge and the surrounding area is second-to-none. Walking safaris can be arranged on request, but the majority of outings are game drives, allowing guests to explore as much of this prolific region of the Luangwa Valley as possible. Drives are led by our experienced team of guides, setting out at first light, and then again in the late afternoon when the wildlife is at its most active. After sundowners, spotlights are used to pick out a new cast of nocturnal creatures.

Dinner is sometimes served by lamplight on the poolside deck overlooking the lagoon. There is a large pool, great for relaxing and typically with views of game while you swim.



CHINDENI BUSHCAMP

SOUTH LUANGWA NATIONAL PARK, ZAMBIA – 3 NIGHTS



Chindeni Camp lies nestled on the apex of a permanent oxbow lagoon, offset by the magnificent Nchendeni Hills. This camp is located in the middle of the walking circuit with fascinating routes between Bilimungwe and Chindeni camps.

Raised on wooden decking Chindeni's four en-suite tented chalets are sheltered by a shady ebony grove. Each chalet has its own private raised veranda from which you can view the resident game and enjoy the serene tranquility of the vast lagoon.

This is the ideal spot for both the avid and intrepid game spotter. The lush and wide lagoon, which stretches out from just beneath your own private balcony, ensures that you need make little effort as you lazily watch the abundance of game that parades into view.



There's something about sleeping under canvas that ignites a sense of adventure in everyone. At Chindeni you can combine that thrill with style and comfort in one of its four opulent tents. Gaze out from your private veranda onto the lagoon which attracts birds and animals from miles around. Or settle back with a gin-and-tonic in the central lounge and dining area – a glorious expanse of varnished decking arranged on several levels around the surrounding ebony trees, boasting, of course, the same spectacular view of the serene lagoon and its inhabitants.

When a camp has 8 guests Bushcamp Company now brings in a second walking guide to ensure flexibility and intimate walks.



ZUNGULILA BUSHCAMP

SOUTH LUANGWA NATIONAL PARK, ZAMBIA – 3 NIGHTS



Zungulila is a charming camp that embodies the essence of old Africa and a bygone era, with breathtaking views onto the Kapamba River and an expansive plain where natural springs attract huge herds of game. Zungulila is eminently peaceful and remote.

If you long to explore Africa as it used to be, Zungulila is a great camp for you. One of Zambia's most talented guides, Fanuel, is typically based at Zungulila and will lead you on foot through some of the park's most untouched wilderness, where large herds of buffalo roam the grassy plains and thirsty elephants come to drink at the springs and along the river.



With limited roads in the area, activities are focused around walking, but to get even further afield, day and night game drives are also on offer.

You can also relax in chairs placed in the shallow river as you just soak it all in.

Limited to eight guests in four spacious tents Zungulila is a very intimate camp. Built under thatch roofs, each shaded tent has its own private bamboo veranda with immense views over an impressive variety of wildlife coming to the river. With stylish interiors, ensuite bathrooms, hot-and-cold running water, outdoor showers and sunken plunge-pool you can enjoy your creatures and your creature comforts in this classic tented bushcamp.



AMANZI CAMP

LOWER ZAMBEZI, ZAMBIA – 4 NIGHTS



Lower Zambezi National Park offers a stunning environment and variety of safari activities. The Zambezi River is the draw as large quantities of animals come to the water in the dry season. The river can be explored by both pontoon boat and canoe. Fishing is tremendous. The rich Zambezi has also produced the growth of towering woodlands that are open and ideal for walking and game driving in a different environment than most other safari locations. Night drives are also possible creating the opportunity to see the full diversity of wildlife and increasing the chances of seeing active predators on the hunt.

Dry season game viewing is top notch in this area. Amanzi is located in a top game viewing area that is remote with only two other camps using this special part of the park. The area has a deserved reputation for outstanding leopard viewing. Elephants and buffalo abound right around camp. Night drives are also productive with civets and genets commonly sighted. Excellent guides deliver a fantastic safari, taking full advantage of the wide range of activities.



Amanzi camp is situated directly on the banks of the Zambezi's Ngwenya channel just two kilometres down stream from it's sister camp, Anabezi. The name "Amanzi" means water and with the intimate position on the Zambezi proves a fitting name.

The camp consists of 4 tents, each with with two double beds on a raised teak deck. The tents have an indoor shower and bathroom, as well as a private sitting area and balcony overlooking the Zambezi.

The camp is intimate, yet private with the tents generously spaced and connected with a raised walkway to the main area.

The main area offers stunning views of the mosaic of islands that are home to a group of majestic elephant bulls. The main area leads down to the pool deck which sits just above the Zambezi River.
